1. Membership

NEW MEMBER POINTS - Excluding Trustees/Contributing
Chapters will earn points for new members enrolled during the period of June 1 – May 31 as follows:

- *Each new full-time member acquired: 1 (one) point - excludes trustees, contributing, part-time, adjuncts, and retirees*
- *Each new adjunct or part-time member acquired: .50 (half) point*
- *New retiree (retiree or life retiree): .25 (quarter) point*

RETENTION BONUS POINTS – Excluding Trustees/Contributing
Chapters will earn bonus point for the percentage of retained members as follows:

- *90% or more members retained: 5 points*
- *75% - 89% of members retained: 2 points*
- *74% or less of members retained: 0 points*

Each year the AFC State Office will provide the previous year's total membership number (excluding trustees/contributing) as of May 31, to the chapter. Examples of the new calculation method will be provided to all chapters.

Total; retention 98% = 5 points;

New member points – 25 total new members (6 at .50; and 19 at 1.0)

The Certified College Professional (CCP) program currently offers the Florida College Professional Certificate (FCPC) which is designed to provide a statewide overview of the Florida College System (FCS), enhance individual job performance, build future leaders, and designate college professionals who demonstrate the knowledge essential to the practice of higher education. The FCPC offers four core courses that are available to be taken either in-person in conjunction with AFC events or online.

Continued improvement and expansion of the program remains a priority of the AFC. To that end, in 2019, the AFC launched the CORE+ workshop series focused on leadership to offer innovative and cutting edge professional development opportunities to AFC members.

Since its inception in 2012, the program has produced 78 graduates, and currently has 44 enrolled participants. Fourteen AFC members, the 8th graduating CCP class, received their Florida College Professional Certificates in the fall of 2019.

SERVICE PROJECTS

The AFC cares about its community. Community is a core value of the Association of Florida Colleges. Each chapter, throughout the year, participates in numerous service projects giving back to their communities. With 28 chapters statewide, the AFC reached over 49 organizations in 2019.

ADVOCACY

The AFC plays a key role in legislative affairs in conjunction with the Council of Presidents and the AFC Legislative Committee. The AFC is prominent in monitoring and protecting college faculty and employee-related issues. These include FRS, DROP, tenure and continuing contracts, and campus safety.

The AFC Legislative Committee includes governmental relations staff from most colleges. Its role is to monitor and analyze proposed bills, develop a framework for substantive policy and budget issues

that arise, provide support for the Council of Presidents, and advocate for all 28 Florida colleges as the Florida College System.

Working with AFC contracted lobbyists from Southern Group, under direction from the Council of Presidents, our colleges fared better during the 2019 Regular Legislative session. Through the collective efforts of our legislative team, about \$16 million in new program funds were appropriated. Additionally, \$40 million in performance funding was appropriated benefitting all colleges.

Capitol Perceptions

Capitol Perceptions is published weekly during the annual Florida Legislative Session. This publication provides updates on current legislative issues and bills as they progress throughout the annual session.

AFC activities, members, chapters, commissions and other groups. It is distributed electronically via the AFC website.

2. The FCPC promotes individual professional skills, as well as knowledge of the Florida College System.
3. The FCPC enhances an individual's resume which may lead to opportunities for advancement.
4. The FCPC provides opportunities for candidates to learn aspects of the Florida College System they may not be exposed to in their day-to-day work environment.
5. The FCPC provides an option through which colleges motivate and reward employees.
6. The FCPC enhances the AFC's role in the professional development of its members.



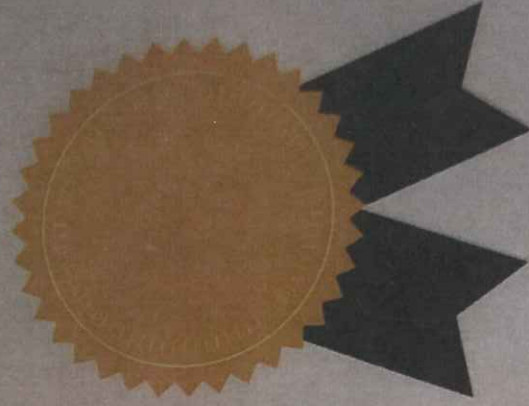

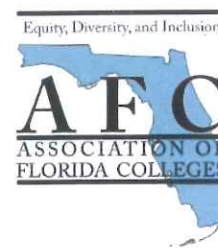

"Many of our students are struggling financially and can't even afford the basic necessities such as food right now because of the coronavirus pandemic," said **Mel Miner**, AFC chapter president. "As a College family, we just want to help them through this tough time."

Food insecurity — defined as limited or uncertain availability of nutritionally adequate and safe foods — is a real issue for many college students during the best of times, Miner added.

"A 2018 Government Accountability Office (GAO) report found that estimates of food insecurity among college students ranged from 9 percent to more than 50 percent," she said. "This was years before we even heard of COVID-19, when our economy was strong. Imagine what our students are facing now especially when many of them work in the service industry."

Nontraditional students also face higher rates of food insecurity.

"Community colleges and trade schools — institutions that attract students who are more likely to be a single parent, receive federal food-assistance benefits or be the first in their family to attend college — are the hardest hit, according to the report. This describes many of our students," Miner noted.

Dr. Lynsey Listau, executive director of Institutional Equity and Student Conduct, echoed Miner's sentiment.

"Yes, the need has increased. Of the students who have been awarded emergency grants/student relief fund grants, 71 percent of them list food as an area of need," Listau said.

"This was the greatest reported area of need for students!"

Dr. Debbie Douma, dean of Grants and Federal Programs, applauded the AFC for holding the food drive.

"Some of my neighbors in Aragon recently held an impromptu food drive for our student food pantry over the Memorial Day weekend, and I know firsthand people want to help out," Douma said. "I was getting deliveries dropped off by neighbors all weekend."

"So many people are hurting financially during this pandemic, and food insecurity is real — especially among college students and others living on the fringes."

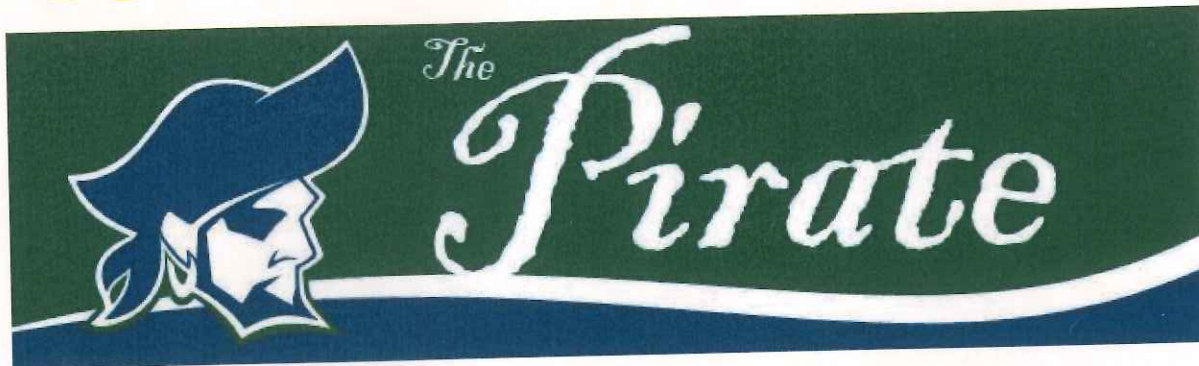

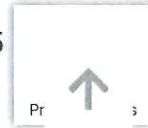

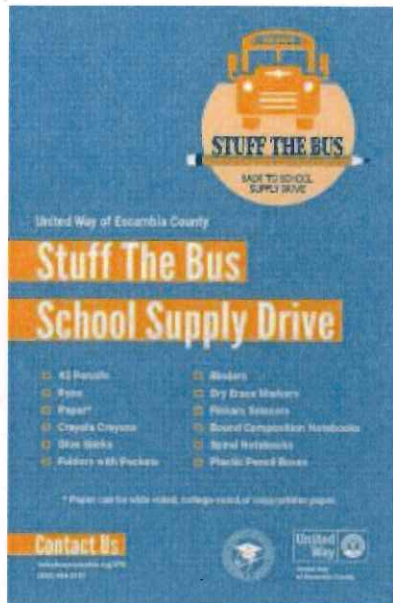
Most recently he coordinated the pick-up and delivery of many school supplies donated for the United Way Stuff the Bus campaign.

BYLAWS of the

PENSACOLA STATE COLLEGE CHAPTER of the

ASSOCIATION OF FLORIDA COLLEGES, INC.

ARTICLE I. NAME

The name of this organization shall be the Pensacola State College Chapter of the Association of Florida Colleges, Inc., hereinafter referred to as the "Chapter."

ARTICLE II. PURPOSE AND RESPONSIBILITY

The purpose of the Chapter shall be to more actively involve individual members at the College in carrying out the goals and purposes of the Association of Florida Colleges, Inc., hereinafter referred to as the "Association," at the local level. To this end, the Chapter shall endeavor

- b. to provide a forum for the discussion of issues that are of interest or importance to the entire College family, including, but not limited to, legislative concerns;

- d. to establish an election procedure for the selection of Chapter delegates to the Assembly of Delegates of the Association and voting representatives to each commission, as provided in the Association bylaws;
- e. to serve as a comprehensive professional organization for anyone employed by, retired from, or associated with Pensacola State College;
- f. to democratically represent the interests of all members, and to provide leadership in seeking solutions to matters of College concerns;
- g. to play an active role in promoting legislation beneficial to the college system and to disseminate information regarding pertinent legislation; and
- h. to promote public understanding and support of the Florida College System.

In view of these goals, and in order to further promote these goals, the Chapter is hereby precluded from becoming involved in the collective bargaining process. The divergent



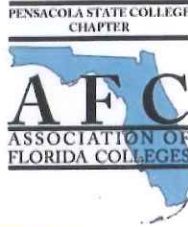


