- In addition, AFC members have helped unload truckloads of donated items for "Michael's Pantry", our distribution area on campus for food and supplies. The pantry is stocked with food, water, diapers, personal hygiene kits, cleaning supplies, pet food, household goods, clothes, blankets, school supplies, and more, all available for free to GCSC students and employees in need. The pantry has run non-stop since the college reopened and is planned to continue at least through the end of February. We cannot say thank you enough for all of the donations from the other AFC Chapters, the other colleges, and the AFC Staff.
