# 1.2 Update, 2018 Legislative Session

President Parker thanked the lobbyists for all their work, with a special thank you to Jack Hall for his leadership in assuring there was an analysis of the language of Senate Bill 540. The information was shared with the presidents to review the items in the bill. President Parker and Dr. LoBasso worked with Chris Hansen and many members of the House and Senate who are on higher education committees. They were also able to meet with Senator Hukill, the sponsor of Senate Bill 540. The first committee stop for this bill will be Monday, November 13, in the Senate Higher Education Committee.

The Florida Council of Resource Development (FCRD), presented a power point report, on Senate Bill 540's proposed changes to Direct Support Organizations and the impact on the college system. President Parker introduced Jackie Skyrd, chair of the council, and her team. The presentation is available on the Association of Florida Colleges website.

President Parker stated she is following the Constitutional Revision Commission. She will be sending the names of the members of the Education Committee of the Constitutional Revision Commission.

President Parker asked the council to be ready to spend time in Tallahassee to sharing individual stories from the colleges.
