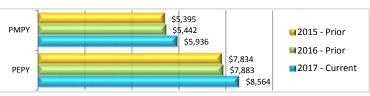

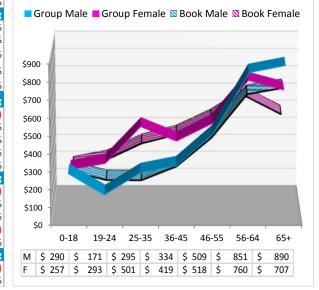

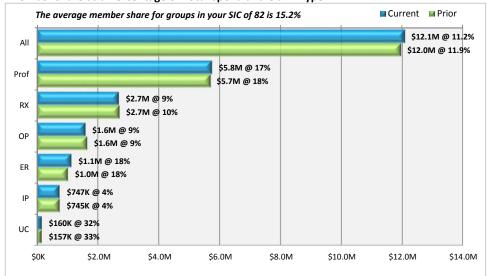
Members By Payment Range

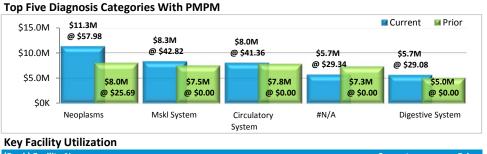


PMPM by Age Range



Member Share as a Percentage of Total Spend and Claim Type

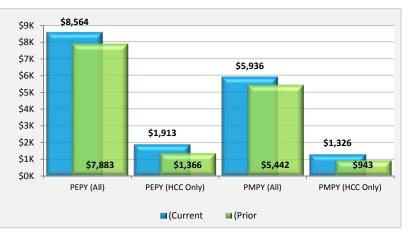




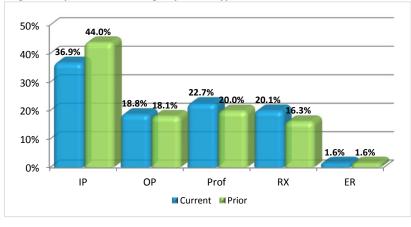

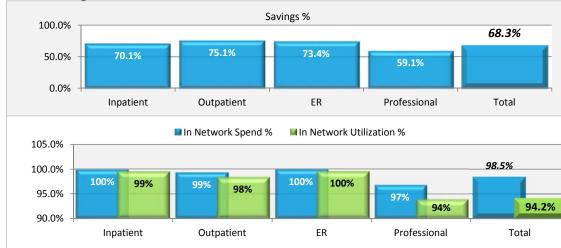


Non Users by Age Bracke Benchmark

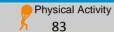
